MINISTER LAUNCHED WATERSHED DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Shillong, December 11, 2003: Meghalaya Minister for Agriculture, Mr P M Syiem and C&RD Minister, Mr J D Rymbai, visited Sohkyrbam , a village in Ri Bhoi District on December 9, 2003 to launch the watershed development project proposed to be implemented by the Department of agriculture during the 10th Five Year Plan period. It may be mentioned that Rs 30 lakhs have been earmarked for this project, which includes two villages, viz, Sohlyrbam and Dongphlang covering an area of about 500 hectares.

To commemorate this event, a public meeting was held where about 600 villagers attended. The meeting was presided over by Mr. W L Mynsong, MDC of the area amidst cultural presentation by participants from the village.

In his speech, Mr J D Rymbai, Minister and MLA of the area said that once the project is implemented it will prove to be a great boon to the farmers of the areas and it will go a long way in elevating their economic conditions. He informed that through this programme, farmers would be benefited through various assistance in the field of agriculture including cattle rearing, piggery, poultry and fishery. He therefore urged upon the implementing officers to work sincerely and give to the farmers their due share. He also announced that the process of creation of the PWD sub-division has been completed and very soon the Sub-divisional office would be established at Jirang.

Also speaking on the occasion, Mr P M Syiem, said that inspite of the majority of the population depending on agriculture for their livelihood, it is disheartening that the farmers continue to face many difficulties, particularly when it comes to marketing their products. Therefore, he expressed the need for the department to strengthen the marketing infrastructure in the State. While encouraging farmers to expand maize cultivation as there is a market potential for this crop, being a major ingredient of cattle and poultry feed, he also expressed satisfaction that the farmers are traditionally practicing organic farming, a concept which the world is attempting to reinforce.

For implementation of the scheme, Mr Syiem, informed that a watershed development committee has been constituted with members form among the villagers. This watershed development committee will be responsible for implementation of watershed development programmes with technical advice of the coordinator or the team leader. To keep track of the progress, he also advised the DHO to videograph the condition of the area before and after implementation of the programmes. Further, he suggested to erect durable signpost for each activity of employed within the project site.
