WORLD DISABILITY DAY CELEBRATED

SHILLONG, DECEMBER 4, 2003: Together with the rest of the world, World Disability Day was celebrated in Shillong on December 3, 2003. The celebration was organised by the Office of the District Social Welfare Officer in collaboration with different Non-Governmental Organisations of the city working for the disabled. The year's celebration was centred around the theme **"Inclusion"**.

With an aim to reach the masses, majority of whom are not even aware of this day, Solidarity Booths have been set up in different parts of the city to enable people to visit the booths and sign a Solidarity Pledge present at the booth. People from all walks of life thronged the booths and pledge support in showcasing the cause of disability in Meghalaya where there are approximately 1,30,000 disabled people (in India there are 6-7 crores disabled people), who were denied a chance to be included in the mainstream. SUMMARY REVISION OF ELECTORAL ROLLS

Shillong, December 4, 2003: The Electors of 37 Bagmara and 53 Chockpot (ST) L. A. Constituencies have been notified of the preparation of electoral rolls in accordance with the Electoral Rule, 1965, the copies of which have been made available for inspection at every polling station locations and the SDO's Office of Baghmara, Rongara, Chokpot and Gasupara and at the Office of the Electoral Registration Officer during office hours with effect from November, 17, 2003 till December 2, 2003 and fixed the dates for special campaign on 5th and 6th instant.

The qualifying date for the preparation of electoral rolls would be January 1, 2004. The period for filling claims and objections had been from November 17, 2003 to December 8, 2003 and disposal of claims and objectives and preparations and printing of supplements on January 15, 004.

WORLD DISABLED DAY AT PATHARKHMAH

Shillong December 4, 2003: Together with the rest of the world the Ri- Bhoi District observed World Disabled Day at Patharkhmah yesterday December 3,2003. FOUNDATION STONE FOR SPORTS COMPLEX LAID
