DIENGPASOH PHC INAUGURATED

Shillong, May 18, 2004: The PHC at Diengpasoh village was inaugurated today by the Meghalaya Minister for Health & Family Welfare, Mr. E D Marak, in the presence of Meghalaya Minister for Cooperation, Mr. Charles Pyngrope, who is also the local MLA of the area. It may be mentioned here that the foundation stone of the PHC was laid down in June, 1997 by the then Health Minister, Late Mr. Kitdor Syiem.

In his inaugural address, Mr. Marak expressed his immense pleasure to be associated with the people of the area and said that the day is a red letter day for them. Besides catering to the basic medical requirements, the PHC would also provide health training programmes to the people which would benefit them, he added.
